



Guideline Updates

- The guideline and decision support tool for late preterm antenatal corticosteroids have been drafted.

- The decision support tool summarizes short-term neonatal benefits and harms of late preterm antenatal corticosteroids, and available evidence on long-term outcomes.

- The guideline will be submitted to the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Canada in mid-July, aiming for full approval by December 2022.

- We are currently piloting the decision support tool among OBGYNs across Canada.

- We will implement edits to the decision support tool based on piloting results and ongoing feedback from our colleagues.
